Notes: This week, we are going to use your song pick, Blue Ridge Cabin Home, sometimes called Blue Ridge Mountain Home, to begin working seriously on both lead and back up. The banjo break is from the classic Flatt & Scruggs recording from their 1957 Columbia LP, Foggy Mountain Jamboree, which is available for download from Amazon. "On Top of Old Smoky" (often spelled "Smokey") is a traditional folk song of the United States. As recorded by The Weavers, the song reached the pop music charts in 1951. It is catalogued as Roud Folk Song Index No. 414. In one version the first verse is the following; for more on the words see below. Earl Eugene Scruggs (January 6, 1924 – March 28, 2012) was an American musician noted for popularizing a three-finger banjo picking style, now called "Scruggs style," which is a defining characteristic of bluegrass music. His three-finger style of playing was radically different from the traditional way the five-string banjo had previously been played.
